- 2. Explain your process in handling a matter like mine?
- 3. Have you handled cases like mine?
- 4. How long have you been handling family law matters?
- 5. What percentage of your practice is dedicated to family law?
- 6. What kind of experience do you have in contested family law cases?
- 7. What are my alternatives in resolving the matter? What is mediation? Is mediation an appropriate alternative to litigation for my case?
- 8. What are the strengths and weaknesses of my case?
- 9. What is expected of me in connection with my case?
- 10. What information will you need from me?
- 11. Will I be working with you throughout my case, or will I be working with another lawyer and/or paralegal? May I meet the other lawyer that might be working on my case?
- 12. What is your hourly rate? What are the hourly rates of the other lawyer and/or paralegal that might be working on my case?
- 13. What is your policy about returning telephone calls?
- 14. Do you expect a retainer (deposit of funds) to be provided? If so, how much?
- 15. What happens when my retainer is used up?

- 16. If you have not used my entire retainer at the end of the case, will you refund the unused portion of my retainer?
- 17. Do you charge for photocopies and faxes? If so, how much?
- 18. Do you accept credit cards?
- 19. Will I be copied on all correspondence about my case?
